Spending time with family, friends and his beloved Shelties made Mike's life complete.

In addition to his wife Debbie, he is survived by his daughters, Stacie Krauss (Tod) of Westminster, MD and Kristie Grachik (Mike) of Delmar; a son, Chad Parker (Denise) of Westchester, PA; and beloved grandchildren, Sierra, Tanner, Trey, Hunter, Kolby, Ty and Grace.
